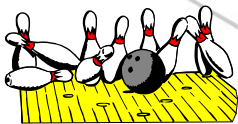

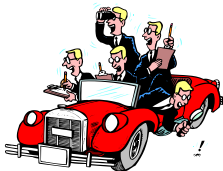

AUCTION TIME AGAIN

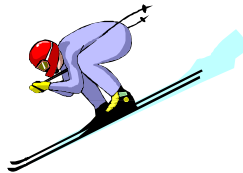
