

The earliest membership dues were \$8.00 for a single with a \$5.00 initiation fee. Membership started out small but in a few years ran up to over 200 members. If you noticed, the year was 1969, so yes, this is the 50th anniversary of our club! 
As one of Beethoven's greatest works, the Spartanburg Philharmonic is thrilled to perform this earth-shattering symphony to close out their season.




